

Description of the Kentaikyo System

Main Features

Kentaikyo System

The Kentaikyo system is a retirement allowance system for construction site workers created by the government under the Smaller Enterprise Retirement Mutual Aid Law.

Under the Kentaikyo system covering the entire construction industry, employers make payments of installments for each construction site workers according to the number of days worked reported in his/her Mutual Aid Notebook, and construction site workers are paid a retirement allowance when they stop working in the construction industry.

Safe secure and simple system

Retirement allowances are calculated and paid accurately in accordance with standards established by the government. The procedures for subscribing and receiving are also very simple.



Retirement allowances are accumulated and calculated across companies

Even if workers switch from one company to another, the retirement allowance will be accumulated throughout all periods and calculated in total.



Parcial exemption from payment of installments

The government will subsidize a portion of installments (50 days' worth of stamps for the first notebook) for newly subscribed workers.



Installments are treated as deductible expenses

The total amount of installments paid by employers is treated as tax-deductible expenses (Order for Enforcement of the Corporation Tax Act, Article 135-1) for incorporated companies and necessary expenses (Order for Enforcement of the Income Tax Act, Article 64-2) for individuals. Installments paid to sub-contractors by the general contractor with Mutual Aid Certification Stamps or retirement allowance points are also treated as construction costs.



Additional points added during business screening

Companies subscribing to the system will receive additional evaluation points during the screening process for submitting tenders for public works.



Applications can be made online

The payment of installments can be made electronically online using the Internet. By using online applications, employers are no longer required to purchase, affix and remove Mutual Aid Certification Stamps and manage them on site. This system also increase transparency because workers can confirm when and by which employer installments were paid.

Subscription certification stickers

Please ensure to display the certification sticker in an area where it is clearly visible, at the entrance/ exit to onsite offices or construction sites when contracting work. Stickers are available at Kentaikyo branches.

Workers eligible to subscribe

Companies involved in the construction industry are eligible
Any individual working on a construction site is eligible to to conclude contracts regardless of whether they are general subscribe to the system regardless of nationality or the job they contractors, or specialized contractors, main contractors or are doing, including carpenters, plasterers, scaffolders, civil subcontractors, regardless of whether they specialize in the engineers, electricians, plumbers, painters, machine operators construction business or provide other services, and regardless and site clerks, etc. and regardless of whether they are paid daily or monthly. However, note that individuals receiving remuneration as executives, full-time employees in the head office or other offices, or individuals who already subscribe to the Smaller Enterprise Retirement Allowance Mutual Aid System, the Sake Brewer Retirement Allowance Mutual Aid System or the Forestry Retirement Allowance Mutual Aid System in accordance with the Smaller Enterprise Retirement Allowance Mutual Aid Law are not eligible for subscription.


-Freelance master craftsmen can also subscribe through voluntary association

If freelance master craftsmen (including craftsmen and apprentices trained under them) come together to form voluntary associations which are certified by the organization in terms of the articles of agreement and skills, they are eligible to subscribe to the system by deeming the associations as the employers and freelance master craftsmen as the employees which are employed by the association.

How to Subscribe

Notebook application form available at Kentaikyo branches located in offices of construction industry associations in all prefectures.




After Subscribing

Having subscribed to the system, employers will be issued with Construction Industry Retirement Allowance Mutual Aid Contract Certificates, and construction site workers will be issued with Construction Industry Retirement Allowance Mutual Aid Notebooks.

Installments Using Mutual Aid Certification Stamps

Purchasing Mutual Aid Certification Stamps

The Kentaikyo System covers all construction sites regardless of whether they are public works or private works. The Mutual Aid Certification Stamps are to be Notebook for the number of days worked on paydays purchased from your nearest financial institution by (at least once per month). presenting your Mutual Aid Contract certificate.




Step 7

Claiming Retirement Allowances

When an employee (beneficiary) is no longer employed in the construction industry, he/she can receive retirement allowances on the condition that the total days of installments (the sum of the total number of Mutual Aid Certification Stamps affixed in the Mutual Aid Notebooks and the number of days of installments allocated online) are 12 months and more (one month calculated as 21 days). Retirement allowances will be paid directly into the account of the claimant when requests for payment are submitted by the employee (beneficiary) or surviving family members.

(If the retirement day was prior to March 31st, 2016, the total days of installments must be at least 24 months.)



Complete the retirement allowance claim form and submit it to a Kentaikyo branch located in offices of construction industry associations in all prefectures together with your Mutual Aid Notebook, your resident card, documents to declare to the tax office, your national identification number (My Number) and a form of personal identification.

In principle, retirement allowances will be transferred directly to the personal savings account specified by the claimant.

Amount of Retirement Allowance

Retirement allowances are calculated on the number of years worked as shown in the chart on the right, and the more years worked, the higher the payment. Retirement allowances for which installments have been paid for 12 months or more and less than 24 months will result in a sum approximately 30% to 50% of the total installments paid. Retirement allowances for people who die when installments have been paid for 12 months or more and less than 24 months will be equivalent to the sum of the installments paid by the employer.

(note) (1) This chart shows the retirement allowance amount based on forecast interest rates and daily installments of 320 ven with one month calculated as 21 days of Mutual Aid Certification Stamps and retirement allowance points.

2) The retirement allowance for people who have been paid installments prior to the change of the daily amount 320 yen will be calculated Differently on the basis of daily installment amount and forecast interest rates applied in the past.

(3) Retirement allowance amounts are subject to change in accordance with revisions to forecast interest rates and daily installment amounts in consideration of expenses, profits and other economic circumstances.

Step 6

When an **Employee** (beneficiary) Resigns

When an employee (beneficiary) must return the Mutual Aid Notebook to the employee. The employer must also explain to the employee that the employee can continue to receive installment as long as he/she continues to work for the construction industry and his/her new employer is subscribed to the system. The employer must also inform the employee (beneficiary) who is eligible to receive a retirement allowance that he/she can claim retirement benefits.

Step 5

Renewing Construction Sito Workers Mutual Aid Notebook

Complete the Notebook Renewal Application form or Notebook Renewal Application form (with financial assistance) and submit it to a Kentaikvo branch located in offices of the construction industry associations in all prefectures.

Please renew your mutual aid notebook once you have filled it with Mutual Aid Certification Stamps for 250 days worked (initial notebook for 200 days worked).


When your Mutual Aid Notebook is due for renewal

The cover of all Mutual Aid Notebooks issued by Kentaikyo after November 2020 show a renewal date. When your notebook is due for renewal, please apply for a new notebook even if it is not filled with Mutual Aid Certification Stamps for 250 days worked.

Mutual Aid Notebooks with no renewal date

Please apply for a new notebook two years after the date of issue even if it is not full filled with Mutual Aid Certification Stamps for 250 days

*If you have applied online, you will be notified of the renewal date via the online application website.



Start of Using Online Applications

To start using online application, employers must submit to a Kentaikyo branch office the Online Application form available on the Employment Record Report Tool or the Kentaikyo website. The Kentaikyo head office will issue a notice containing a temporary ID and password to access the online application website. *Online applications are free.

Purchasing Retirement Allowance Point

Purchase Retirement Allowance Points can be purchased by using Pay-easy or via bank transfer.

Creating an Employment Record Report File

Employers enter the number of days worked in private and public works into the Employment Record Report Tool and create an Employment Record Report file.

Registering an Employment **Record Report File**

Employers register the Employment Record Report file on the online application website.

Allocation of Installments

Purchased retirement allowance points will be allocated by the Kentaikyo head office (paid) as installments in accordance with the Employment Record Report by the Kentaikyo head office.

*Installments are to be paid in full by the employer. Employers can not force workers to pay any part of installments by any ways including the deduction from their wages, etc.

Attention all employers

Kentaikyo requires workers to collect retirement allowances from financial institutions in Japan before they return to their home countries.

All employers are kindly requested to complete all procedures as soon as possible once the retirement dates of workers are fixed.
